

PORTLAND ROSE SOCIETY'S ALL-MINIATURE ROSE SHOW AUGUST 6th, 2022

PITTOCK MANSION

The Pittock Mansion is located off Burnside Street about one mile from the intersection of 23rd and Burnside. Turn onto Barnes road and follow the signs to the Mansion. Park in the lot, grooming will be on the sidewalks surrounding the Mansion. We will not be hard to find. If you have a portable table, you might want to bring it with you if you can.

GENERAL SHOW RULES

1. This show will usually follow the American Rose Society Rose Show rules. **All** amateur rose growers are welcome to exhibit in this show. There are no fees associated with entering.
2. Entries will be from 6:30-9:00 am.
3. Only containers provided by the PRS are to be used except for entries in the rose arrangement section.
4. Proper identification and classification are the responsibility of the exhibitor, however, assistance will be available.
5. No wedging (including detached leaves) or supporting material may be used.
6. An entry may be disqualified if it: 1) is misnamed; 2) is not grown outside; 3) has foreign substance on the foliage, stem, or bloom; 4) the exhibitor's name is showing or missing; or 5) violates the show rules.
7. There are special sections for novice exhibitors, but novices are permitted to enter roses in any class in the show if they choose.
8. The decisions of the judges are final.
9. Trophies will be awarded at 2:30 pm on Saturday. Winners should be present to accept their trophies at that time or should make arrangements with the trophy chair, Dr. Charold Baer, or Show Chair, Jim Stahl, for later pick-up. Ribbons will be mailed.
10. In consideration of no charges being assessed

to exhibit in this show, each exhibitor agrees that the PRS and the Pittock Mansion will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any person or property; however, care will be exercised to protect exhibits on display.

9. In sections where all color classes are not represented, the first word in the color class will determine where the entry should go. For example, a Pink Blend rose goes in the Pink section.
10. **Miniflora roses have their own classes and should not be entered with the miniature roses unless stated otherwise in the schedule.**

VIRTUOSO (EASY) CLASSES

MINIATURE AND MINIFLORAS can be used in any combination for classes. 40-51

Class 40 Competition. Three individual blooms, three varieties, exhibited in one container.

Class 41 Bloom Progression. Three stems, one variety. One bud showing color, one bloom at exhibition stage, and one fully open (stamens must show). Exhibit should be staged with the bud at the top, fully open rose at the bottom. Exhibited in one container.

Class 42 Rainbow Hues Competition. Five blooms, each bloom from a different color class - blends are acceptable. Displayed in one container.

Class 43 English Rose Box. Six **DIFFERENT** varieties, exhibited in a miniature rose box. No foliage. PRS boxes only.

Class 44 Colorama. Four roses displayed in one container. One white, one yellow, one pink, and one red, blends are acceptable.

Class 45 Rose in a Champagne Glass. One rose, exhibition form, no foliage, displayed floating in a champagne glass. Glasses provided by the PRS.

Class 46 Vase of Five. Five blooms, five stems, one variety, exhibited in one container.

Class 47 Daring Dozen. Consisting of either 12 of one variety or mixed varieties with no more than three of any one variety displayed in one container. A container with oasis will be provided by the PRS for this entry.

Class 48 Spray Challenge. Three sprays each of a different variety displayed in one container.

Class 49 Rose Portrait. One exhibition form rose exhibited in a picture frame with one leaf with either three or five leaflets (need not be attached to the rose). Frames will be provided by the PRS. **(One entry per household)**

Class 50 Three Open Blooms. Three open blooms, three stems, consisting of either three different varieties **OR** three of the same variety of fully open blooms, (stamens must show) staged in one container.

Class 51 Rose Palette. Five exhibition form blooms, five different varieties, five different color classes arranged left to right on the palette going from light to dark color classes.

ROSE ARRANGEMENT GUIDELINES

1. Roses must be the dominant flower.
2. Roses should be correctly named.
3. No artificial plant materials may be used.
4. Only one entry per class.
5. Dimensions in inches are for the maximum overall size of the arrangement, which includes height, width, and depth.

Trophies will be awarded for the best traditional, modern/creative, oriental, and personal adornment.

Class C "BBQ": Traditional Line Mass Design - Horizontal Design: (10" Overall)

Class E "Star Gazing": Creative/Modern Design: (10" Overall)

Class F "Canoe Rides": Oriental Moribana Design Showing Water: (7" Overall)

Class G "Fireworks": Oriental Ikebana Tall Design: (10" Overall)

Class H "Roasting Marshmallows": Corsage: Must include ribbon and pin: (7" Overall)
